ENVIRONMENT COMMUNITY SERVICE PROGRAM, Phyllis Salzburg, Chairman. Thanks to all who helped celebrate Earth Day by donating socks for the SmartWool, 2nd Cut Sock Collection! 4 members donated 5 pounds of socks which were delivered to the collection box at Jax. SmartWool ships the socks to a company that deconstructs the hard to recycle socks and makes them into new items such as dog beds.

WYOMING HUNGER INITIATIVE. Are you planning a vegetable garden this summer? The WHI, collaborating with UW Extension and the Cent\$ible Nutriiton Program, is encouraging home gardeners to share with local food pantries, social service agencies, crisis centers, and others through the *Grow a Little Extra Project*. Community gardens, churches and organizations are also encouraged to establish a garden dedicated to growing food for the community.
